

Energy efficiency is a selling point

- Governments face trade off between policy goals and political approval, and operate in a time constrained framework and often tight public budget.
- People have different priorities and concerns over air pollution or climate change may be secondary to those who fear welfare losses.
- Recent switch in the political language shows that it is easier to 'sell' an energy and environmental strategy that delivers also in terms of economic development.

Not only benefits but also some costs

- Improving energy efficiency both in residential and industrial use delivers benefits but all that glitter is not gold!
- Changes in consumer's preferences and structural changes in production are likely to create losers and winners in the economy, even if the net impact of positive.
- Government funded projects may require increase in taxes or reallocation of other public spending.
- Different benefits will come at different times, and costs of efficiency improving interventions may delay the direct return on efficiency investment.
